Acceptable usage

At Bath Tutorial College, we expect all students to be responsible for their own behaviour on the Internet. All students must comply with the course rules as detailed in the Parent Welcome Pack.

Any infringement of this Code of Conduct will be treated in line with our disciplinary guidelines and may also result in the removal of ICT (*Computer/Mobile Phone, etc.) and Wi-Fi privileges.

Appropriate content

Just as certain types of offensive and inappropriate material have no place in the college, neither do they online. Content filters are in place at the college but due to the dynamic nature of the internet these cannot be 100% guaranteed, and ultimately the responsibility lies with the user. Please note that there is a time-stamped log of webpage access and anyone found to be accessing inappropriate content will have their Wi-Fi privileges revoked and may face further disciplinary action.



Cyberbullying

Bath Tutorial College has a zero tolerance policy for bullying. Any types of bullying, harassment, attempts to embarrass, deceive, or manipulate online are unacceptable and will be treated in line with our [Anti-Bullying Policy](#).

E-Safety

All students are responsible for their own online safety and should observe the following precautions when using the internet:

Do Not:

- Believe everything you read online
- Arrange to meet strangers that you have met through the internet
- Reply to strangers, people who you don't know
- Accept or post insults in any form (text, photo, video)
- Click on adverts or download anything from an unknown link

Do:

- Keep your personal information such as your address, phone number and passwords private
- Tell a member of staff if you have seen or read anything that you think may be offensive or illegal
- Be aware of your audience, who can see your photos/ posts? People may not be who you think they are
- Save your work regularly and make a "back up" of your work on another computer or USB pen
- Log out of websites on a shared computer when you have finished
- Limit the amount of time you spend on-line and remember that real life social interaction is always better than virtual on-line interaction
- Ask for permission before you take someone's photo

At the beginning of the course, your child will be required to sign to say they have understood and agree with the Bath Tutorial College Student Internet Code of Conduct.
